The approach is only concerned with observable

stimulus-response behaviors, and states all behaviors are learned through interaction with the environment., Key Concepts. Behaviorism is a worldview that assumes a learner is essentially passive, responding to environmental stimuli. The learner starts off as a clean slate (i.e. tabula rasa) and behavior is shaped through positive reinforcement or negative reinforcement [2].Both positive reinforcement and negative reinforcement increase the probability that the antecedent behavior will happen again.

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
