enough to be divided, not into books as is usual with Aristotle's works, but ..., Aristotle conceives of ethical theory as a field distinct from the theoretical sciences. Its methodology must match its subject matterâ€“good actionâ€“and must respect the fact that in this field many generalizations hold only for the most part.
