Behavior modification refers to behavior-change procedures that were employed during the 1970s and early 1980s.

Based on methodological behaviorism, overt behavior was modified through the use of presumed consequences, including positive and negative reinforcement contingencies to increase desirable behavior, or administering positive and negative punishment and/or extinction to reduce behavior., 3 These immediate reinforcers can in turn add up to a secondary reinforcer (tangible reward) at the end of the day or week in order to provide additional motivation.
